ACTIVITIES

SPECIFIC TASKS INCLUDE



Developing a charter and process for collaboration



Gathering and synthesizing research and other information on assessments



Identifying priorities for measures and tools that align with SAP program goals



Selecting appropriate tools for use in Erie County youth education programs

Goal

The workgroup will identify and recommend promising assessments, tools, and other enhancements to build capacity among SAP partners to strengthen the development of Erie County children and youth. Cullen will then work with local organizations to purchase as many of these assessments and supports as are practicable. In the long term, the initiative also seeks to transition the workgroup into a learning community that is sustained beyond the 9-month period.

Timeline

The workgroup will run for the duration of this school year with the goal of funding local nonprofits' efforts to assess student growth in their afterschool, in-school, and summer programs. On a monthly basis, this workgroup will bring together Supplemental Academic Program (SAP) partners serving Erie County to synthesize research findings with their expertise as practitioners and plan for the future.
